Years 7-11 Dress Code

- A single-breasted black blazer with the school badge sewn on the breast pocket.
- An authorised school tie worn at the waist length with crest showing.
- A traditional white, long or short-sleeved shirt. Shirts must be tucked in and ties outside the shirt.
- Traditional tailored black trousers, not jeans, canvas or skinny. If a belt is worn, then no elaborate buckle.
- Black or dark grey socks.
- Black school style shoes, not trainers or boots or shoes with logos/motifs.
- Pullovers, if worn, must be V-neck and be plain black, without logos/motifs. Sweatshirts, crewneck jumpers or hoodies are not permitted.
- Hair should be clean and tidy. It must not be dyed, excessively styled or shaved.
- Earrings, studs or conspicuous jewellery items including rings are not allowed.
- No nail varnish of any kind.
- Outdoor coats must be dark in colour, without prominent motifs. No hoodies or zipped tops to be worn in place of coats.
- Luminous bands and a helmet for cyclists.
- In the summer blazers are optional but a school tie must always be worn. Pullovers must not be worn without the blazer.

Maidstonians must wear full and correct school uniform at school and when travelling to and from school.

The Headteacher may forbid any item or appearance he considers inappropriate.

Students who do not meet these expectations will be referred to the Senior Leadership Team. Escalating sanctions will be issued for repeated non compliance.

Sixth Form Dress Code

The Sixth Form Dress Code is designed to:

- ensure students dress for school as they would in a business environment and befitting to a school like MGS that has a long-established traditional ethos.
- provide the opportunity for fairness, choice and diversity across the student body.

The guidance opposite will hopefully allow students to make a thoughtful and considered choice about the clothes worn at school in relation to their gender identity. Whilst this will not affect many students, we believe it is the right course of action to support those individuals for whom this is a significant matter.

Students who fail to abide by these regulations will be referred to the Senior Leadership Team. Escalating sanctions will be issued for repeated non compliance; students may be isolated or sent home immediately to change and contact will be made with parents. Continued failure to meet expectations will result in a formal meeting with the Headteacher.

The Headteacher may forbid any item or appearance if he considers it inappropriate.

Shoes/Socks/Tights	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Formal dark coloured shoes, enclosed-toe and sensibly-heeled. • Dark coloured socks, or naturally coloured/neutral tights/stockings. 	Trainers or plimsolls of any description. Bright coloured shoes, socks, tights or stockings. Boots
Coats	Coats should be dark/neutral in colour.	Hooded tops, fleeces, zipped tops, sport tops or sweatshirts are not to be substituted for a coat. No bright colours.
Jewellery/Accessories	Earrings must be no more than one pair of plain studs (one stud to be worn in each ear).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visible facial piercings including tongue piercings. • Hooped or hanging earrings. • More than one ring per hand. • Bling/diamanté jewellery.
Hair & Makeup	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair should be neat and tidy and be of a natural colour. • Clean shaven (where this applies), except for religious or medical reasons (when agreed by the Headteacher) • Make-up should be discreet. • Nail varnish should be colourless/neutral. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visible tattoos. • Long artificial nails. • Bright coloured nail varnish.

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
